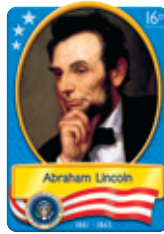


Hail to the Chief

★ Featured Display

Name that president in a playful, fact-filled way!

- Put several president portrait cards on display.
- Use Make-Your-Own Pocket Flash Cards, hook-and-loop tape, and information from the Discovery Guide to feature facts about various presidents.
- Make it more challenging by posting facts about presidents not pictured.
- Have students take turns matching a fact with the picture of the president.
- Ask students to identify the presidents carved on Mount Rushmore. (Bonus)

Continue the activity by replacing presidents and facts now on the display with new ones. Also explore interesting information about the Oval Office and the White House (photos included in set).
